The following scholarships are offered to JOHNSTOWN HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS. Please study the criteria and CHECK NEXT TO THE DESCRIPTION ONLY THOSE FOR WHICH YOU ARE ELIGIBLE OR WISH TO APPLY.

- THE FRANCIS (FRED) GUZIELEK SCHOLARSHIP – given by the friends of Pino's Restaurant and the Robert J Hoy Agency, to two students pursuing a degree in teaching. Special consideration will be given to those pursuing a degree to teach History and who also played high school basketball. Must have maintained an 85 average through 4 years of High School.
- MICHAEL CARTER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – given in memory of Michael Carter, a deceased member of the Class of 2010.
- WILLIAM HLADIK SCHOLARSHIP - Six \$500 scholarships given by friends & family of the late William Hladik, to seniors who are involved in school, career goals, and interests.
- H. BRADFORD & CHARLES NORTHRUP SCHOLARSHIP - A \$500 award given annually to a college-bound senior or graduate of Johnstown High School, who has made a significant contribution to the school and community life through participation in extra-curricular activities including, but not limited to the arts, athletics, and community service.
- JAMES J. & KATHRYN M. BROYLES SCHOLARSHIP – A \$500 scholarship given by their family to a student who shows determination, initiative, and hard work in their studies. The student should be involved in school activities.
- KATHERINE BUCHNER SCHOLARSHIP - \$500 given to a senior, who has exemplified school citizenship, demonstrated school involvement, personified dedication to community and school.
- THE JACK DUNLAP MEMORAL ATHELETE SCHOLARSHIPS - \$1000 awarded to a graduating student athlete who displays a strong work ethic, dedication, and willingness to get involved.
- THE DR. JOAN L. COLVIN-HELEN A. FAILING SCHOLARSHIP - A \$500 scholarship given anonymously to honor the leadership and dedication to the students and staff of Johnstown by these two faculty members and presented to a student who leads by example, achieves excellence, and is supportive of and helpful of others.

- JHS CLASS OF '41 ACHIEVEMENT AWARD** - Given by the Class of 1941 to two seniors who have achieved the greatest scholastic progress over his or her four years at Johnstown High School and who does further his/her education. This year the award is \$500 each.
- THE JHS CLASS OF 1967 SCHOLARSHIP** – A \$500 scholarship given to a senior who is kind and has a love of learning.
- THE JD ALDRICH SCHOLARSHIP** – Presented to a graduating Johnstown High School student who has exemplified a strong commitment to music.
- THE JOHN F. HALL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - A \$250 scholarship to students who exemplify John's qualities: character, dedication, discipline, unselfishness, team spirit and leadership.
- THE WINNER'S CIRCLE RESTAURANT SCHOLARSHIP** - \$250 scholarship to a graduating senior who is involved in an extra-curricular activity, has a part-time job or works as a volunteer on a regular basis (firefighter, hospital worker, etc.) and has a grade point average of 85% or higher.
- THE EDWARD A. ZILKA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** -given by his family & friends to a male student who played at least two sports (football, basketball or baseball) or girl who played two sports (soccer, basketball or softball) and intends on furthering his/her education. They must have B+ or higher average. \$250.00
- THE ARLENE M. SITTERLY SCHOLARSHIP** - a \$250 scholarship given to a student who participates in business classes, is community minded, and a self-starter, as well as goal oriented with excellent communication skills.
- THE ELEANOR MILLER REED MEMORIAL SCIENCE AWARD** - \$1000. Given to a graduating senior who will continue his/her education and who has shown an interest in and an appreciation for the study of science throughout four years of high school.
- CLIO STUDY CLUB MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$250 given in memory of deceased members, to a female senior who demonstrates kindness, compassion, and continuing her education.
- THE ELIZABETH SUBIK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$300. *Given to a graduating senior who will continue his/her education in a health related field.*
- THE PAUL L. MEHER SR. SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD** - \$1000. Given to a senior bowler who will continue his/her education. Student must carry at least a "C" average, show positive sportsmanship on the team, as well as, positive citizenship in school.
- THE MARY ANN S. FOSTER SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE IN MATH** - A \$500 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior planning to continue his/her education in the field of math or computer science. Four years of Regents and/or AP level math classes are required. Each candidate must have displayed a commitment to excellence in their studies amongst their peers and teachers.

**JOHN P. SIEDLECKI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - given by the JHS Student Council to deserving seniors planning to further their education beyond high school. Selection based upon leadership and services both in and out of school.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD** - Two \$300 scholarships given by the Greater Johnstown Lions Club, to a graduating senior who has demonstrated significant community service over the past four years.

**THE JOHNSTOWN PBA SCHOLARSHIP** - A \$250 scholarship awarded to someone who has been accepted in a four-year higher education program.

**SGT. SEAN HIGGINS SCHOLARSHIP** - A \$250 scholarship given to a graduating senior planning to attend a two or four-year college. Preference will be given to students involved in Johnstown High School athletics.

**THE ARTHUR C. BATTY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$250 presented to a student who has shown a desire to be a good citizen both in the school and in the community, as well as displaying a personal effort toward academic achievement throughout his/her high school years.

**THE FOLLOWING SCHOLARSHIPS NEED A SEPARATE ESSAY!**

☐ **THE FRANK AND HELEN MANDATO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship. The applicants must be graduating from Johnstown High School and planning to attend a college or university. Must be an active member, part-time employee, or does volunteer service for the YMCA. Selection will be made based on need and academic standing. Please include in your essay what influence the YMCA has had on your life.

☐ **THE SHEPARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$300 scholarship given by Trackside Association to a hardworking senior who has applied themselves and overcome hardship. This scholarship is not for the top ten percent. It is for a student furthering their education in geriatrics, psychology, a participating field of medicine, ex: Doctor, nurse, analyst, therapist et al. medical or community outreach who is currently working part time. Has financial need. Please complete a one to three page essay explaining their current circumstances, need and why they deserve the scholarship.

☐ **THE MARTY COLLINS – JHS CLASS OF 1966 SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$1500 scholarship established in 2016 by Marty Collins, a 1966 graduate of Johnstown High School. This will be given to a graduating senior who is in the top 20% of their class, plans to attend college, is economically disadvantaged, and has the drive and ambition to succeed in the future. Students who wish to apply must write a 1-2 page essay stating why receiving this scholarship is important to them and how they plan to further their education.

☐ **THE JHS PTSA 2020 EMPLOYMENT AWARD,** a \$250 scholarship given by the Johnstown PTSA to a deserving student who has chosen not to attend college and enter into the world of work in a chosen career.

☐ **THE KURT KAISER SCHOLARSHIP** - a scholarship of at least \$500 given by the Glove Cities Rotary Club, Inc. to a student pursuing further education in the medical field.

The essay should be one page and include:

1. A description of your reasons for your career choice
2. An explanation of why you should receive this scholarship
3. An identification of any special circumstances about yourself that you believe the scholarship committee should consider
4. What you will do in the college preparatory program to justify the scholarship committee's confidence in you

□ **THE DAVID E. HORNIDGE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$1,000 given to two graduating students who are well-rounded, two sport athletes looking to further their education after graduation. Given by his sons, Tyler and Alec Hornidge.

To apply, please write a one page essay describing how your extracurricular activities in high school have contributed to your success. Include your future plans for education and how this scholarship could benefit you.

□ **MAYOR MICHAEL B. JULIUS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** – a \$1000 scholarship available to a senior who is a resident of the City of Johnstown, planning to attend college or university and preferably pursue a career in health sciences, but not limited to such. The student must have a GPA of 85% or higher, be involved in an extra-curricular activity, and have a part-time job or volunteer/do community service on a regular basis. Selection will also be based on exemplary character, with an emphasis on compassion and unselfishness.

Mayor Julius wanted to make Johnstown a better place for everyone so that it could grow again. He was saddened that the youth would leave after completing their education and that young families did not relocate to Johnstown, a city he truly loved. If you would like to apply for this scholarship, you must have completed the Johnstown High School Scholarship packet, meet the above criteria and write a 250-500 word essay on **one** of the following subjects:

- What changes would you like to see in Johnstown that would make young people want to live here after furthering their education?
- What do you like or not like about living in this city, and can you think of any improvements?
- Do you see a future for yourself in Johnstown, and if so, what do you see yourself doing?
- If you were ever to hold a position in city government, what would you do?

All essays should be double spaced, with your name on each page and turned in to Guidance by May 1, 2020. You **do not** need to fill out another scholarship application.

□ **THE ZACH BIRON & ZACH HOLMES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - \$300 awarded to a student who is a two sport athlete with an 80+ average.

Include a short essay about the effect drug use, even only one time, could have on yourself and your family.
